Life Program is that each man gets his G.E.D. or the appropriate education for his future. **Education increases opportunities for the residents.**

Growing up in Peru was good but most of the neighborhood guys were older than me. I used to buy the beer for them and sometimes they would give me a glass of beer for doing it, so I acquired the taste of it and I liked it. I started doing drugs at 14 and drinking was normal. I made a living of working, partying, and my addiction got worse to the point that I went from job to job, ruined my marriage, and had two kids that I didn't even talk to or see grow up. My life was a mess until I decided to change and do something about it. So I went to a program in 1993 where I met God and became a born again Christian. It was a great experience studying and working in a ministry helping people. Now that my life had changed, the problem was living a sober life which I had not experienced until I went out on my own and found out that it was hard to live a clear life because the world is full of corruption, hatred, etc. Here at the Rescue Mission, I renewed my life to God and let Him take charge of my life. I go to Recovery class every morning five days a week and work in the kitchen in the afternoon which is my trade. I enjoy cooking for the community and giving food away to the people in need. Part of this ministry is to get a high school diploma which is why I go every Tuesday to Walkersville. I go to Bible study on Thursday, Centennial Church on Saturday and Liberty Church on Sunday.



The rest of my time I spend working and studying for my G.E.D. It's a blessing being here letting God work on me and my family while I serve Him. I also have begun a relationship with my son and daughter who I talk to at least 2 or 3 times a month and I go to be with my mom and sister twice a month. What I know now is that no matter what happens God is going to work it out for me as long as I keep doing the right thing.
