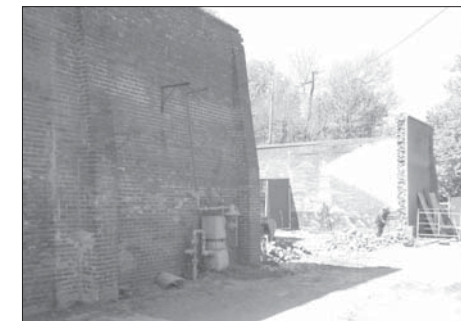

**FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR**

The Frederick Rescue Mission is getting ready to change forever. On May 19, 2010, the Mission broke ground to start the expansion of its building. Once the building is finished, there will no longer be hungry, broken people standing out in the heat, rain, cold, snow, and other kinds of weather. They will be able to come inside and eat together rather than in shifts. The 35 space dining hall will be no more; it will be replaced by a 120 space dining hall.

There will also be more space to worship and have large group meetings. Even though the Beacon House was once a large jail, it has no big rooms in it. The Changed life Recovery Program will have a better situation for classes and life skills training in the future.

The Frederick Rescue Mission is not interested in having elaborate buildings. We recognize buildings are tools not monuments. A new

building will give the Mission a valuable tool in changing lives. Presently we are limited in our interactions with those who come for food and clothes. With the new building, we can go further in not only changing lives now but changing lives for eternity.

We are already blessed with close to 1.2 million dollars pledged. A million more is needed to finish our Capital Campaign. Breaking ground was a huge start. Yet we will need much support to complete the building. You received this newsletter because at some point you have given or shown interest in God's work at the Frederick Rescue Mission. Please ask God how He would like to use you in this project.

**SUMMER CHALLENGE RECIPE**

A very generous donor recently donated 800 pounds of chicken! Because it's grilling season, I decided to make BBQ Chicken with homemade sweet BBQ sauce.

- 1 No. 10 Can Ketchup
- 1 Lb. Brown Sugar
- 10 oz. Peach Glaze
- 2 Tbsp Garlic Powder
- 2 Tsp Red Pepper
- 2 Tbsp Onion Powder
