FOOLS DESPISE WISDOM AND DISCIPLINE.
– PROVERBS 1:7

Proverbs 1:7 says, "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom". One of our main goals is to help a man dispel that unhealthy fear by learning to fear the Lord. While residents are much smarter than they are given credit for and are certainly street-wise, none of that equates to godly wisdom. So part of our program is Bible study. Beginning with the book of Proverbs, they can begin to comprehend what true wisdom is.

Along with Bible teaching, residents work through Christ-centered Addiction Recovery material, which addresses the root issues driving their addiction. They also receive assistance in education, career assessment, personal life and inter-relational skills, all of which can help a man become wise and successful.

The key however is that a man has to want these things and be willing to work at them.

Here are three of the mottos I believe are essential to anyone desiring to become wise and successful:

1. The desire to truly become wise is already a demonstration of wisdom
2. Only God holds the wisdom of eternal value
3. You can't stop doing what makes you successful

For my last word I'll add one more to the list... "If you think you're wise, you're demonstrating a need for wisdom".

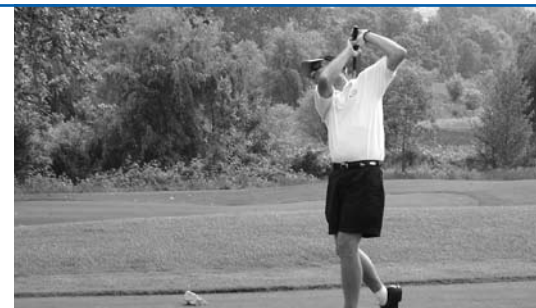

The HTH walkathon Program is a participation grant, which means the more beneficiary agencies invest in the program the greater their awards.
