



## **VOLUNTEER DRESS CODE**

When volunteering at the Frederick Rescue Mission, please dress modestly. At the Mission, we provide services to men in a residential recovery program as well as men, women and children in need. It is important to observe an appropriate dress code. We recognize the divergence in views on style and fashion and we respect the judgment of our volunteers. We do wish, however, to state clearly the dress code policy for our volunteers.

The Ministry Team, administrative and front office volunteers should follow the listed guidelines below with the expectation of closed toed shoes and sleeveless shirts.

### **Permitted in our food service areas including our Food Distribution Center and Rescued Treasures:**

- T-shirts, long, short sleeve shirts
- Jeans
- Shorts or skirts (should be fingertip length or longer)
- Sneakers or work boots
- Closed-toed shoes
- Clothes covering abdominal area, upper arms and chest
- Spandex tights with a shirt covering abdominal area

### **Not permitted in our food service areas including our Food Distribution Center and Rescued Treasures:**

- Open-toed shoes
- “See through” material
- Sleeveless shirts, low neck blouses, halter tops, bare midriff, tub tops or strapless tops
- Clothing with provocative slogans, drawings, signs, gang related or other wording or artwork that does not align with the Christian philosophy of the Frederick Rescue Mission
- Provocative garments
- Appropriate undergarments must be worn

Thank you for volunteering and serving as a role model for our residents and guests. If you have any questions regarding our dress code policy, please contact us. If you arrive to the Mission to volunteer and are not in compliance with our dress code policy, you could be asked to leave and not volunteer on that specific day.
